Important information about this consent

Recreational flying of unpowered model aircraft at St Agnes Head, outside of the bird breeding season. Launching and landing will take place within the three heathland areas marked on the map in green above, flying within the airspace marked in red lines.

Part 3: How you intend to carry out each operation

Describe how you, or someone you are permitting, intend to undertake your proposed operations.

This proposal is for British Model Flying Association affiliated groups to operate radio controlled slope soaring model gliders at St Agnes Head. Radio controlled model aircraft broadly fall into two basic categories; powered and unpowered. Unpowered models are better known as gliders or sailplanes and are categorised as silent flight models. These rely solely on wind for propulsion and are controlled in flight by flying surfaces operated remotely by micro electric motors driven by a small 6-volt battery.

At St Agnes Head unpowered model fliers elect exclusively to fly models in the slope soaring class, relying on the lift generated by rising air over the coastal cliff face. Models vary in size from wingspans of less than 1 metre to larger models of up to 4 metre

wingspan. Methods of construction are based on a variety of materials from foam through balsa wood and plywood to composite materials of epoxy glass and carbon. Flying weights vary from around 300 gms up to 5 kgs for the larger models.

The 3 take off and landing areas used for flying at St Agnes Head as shown in green on the map above are;

No.1 is used for wind directions from West to North West. The models are launched by hand from the cliff edge and landed within 30 metres of the launch point between the car park and the NCI station.

No.2 is used for wind directions from South West to WNW. The models are launched by hand from an elevated point in front of the coastal path and are landed on level heather covered ground within 30 metres of the launch point.

No.3 is used for wind directions from North West to NNE with models launched by hand from a point in front of the coastal path. The landing zone is within 50 metres of the launch point and to the East of the car park.

Part 4: When you intend to carry out, cause or permit the operations

Indicate any specific considerations or restrictions relating to the timing of each proposed operation, such as certain weather or ground conditions

The flying of model gliders is only possible at St Agnes in suitable conditions; when wind direction is within the range SW to NNE, there is good visibility typically more than 3 to 5 km and when conditions are dry.

The potential impact of the proposed activity on the SSSI features focusses particularly on the breeding bird assemblage. Unpowered model aircraft were observed causing disturbance to breeding birds (including schedule 1 Peregrine) in the bird breeding season within the SSSI at St Agnes in 2022 and as a result this activity will only be licenced outside of the breeding bird season within the SSSI.

The bird breeding season is defined from 1st February to 31st August based on previous monitoring and advice from licenced schedule 1 monitors of breeding birds to enable the breeding bird assemblage to successfully choose a nest site, breed and for their dependent young to fledge and be allowed time to carry out training hunting flights in the case of Schedule 1 Peregrine.

The period in which unpowered model flying will be licenced and therefore the period in which we are seeking for consent for is from 1st September 2025 to 31st January 2026.

Monitoring of schedule 1 breeding birds at St Agnes Head will be carried out by the National Trust team during breeding bird season and data gathered will be used to inform future breeding season restriction dates.

The risk to grey seal is seen as very low given that there are no identified grey seal haul out sites below the indicated flying area and that model flying will take place in excess of 100m separation from any possible grey seal.

The three take off and landing areas are locations where the vegetation is largely short grass or pioneer heathland, with the footprint estimated to be an area of 1 hectare in each of the 3 locations, a proportion of which is the coastal footpath.
